Foreword

In 1976, WBro James W. Speed III appointed a committee to produce a history of James B. Green Lodge No. 735 A.F. & A. M. The committee consisted of WBro James S. Johnson Jr. PM, WBro Paul Etheridge Jr. PM, and Bro George L. Stockstill - Chairman. These Brethren created a history that went from the beginnings of the Lodge through the 10th year in 1976. This history was published with the assistance of Robin Mentha, who edited the work and Bro Clifton Gibson Jr., whose firm published the original document; sadly, none of the members of that committee are with us today.

In this the 50th year of our Lodge, I felt that it was most appropriate and timely to revisit our history. This work is the result of that effort. The spirit and much of the content of the original work is included in the first 10 years in this document. The next 40 years are a compilation of information selected from the Lodge Annual Reports, Lodge Minutes, and personal recollections of various individuals who were there. The writing styles are different but the intent is the same, to give a sense of history to the reader.

A Glossary of Abbreviations and Terms is included at the end of the document to assist the reader.

James Bryan Green

1873 - 1964



He was born on September 2, 1873 in Wake County. Worshipful Brother James B. Green married Mary Rose Morgan of Dublin, Virginia in 1907. Mrs. Green died in 1926. They were the parents of two daughters: Mrs. Sarah Adell McLendon of Winston Salem and Miss Margret Rose Green of Raleigh. Sarah is the wife of Hubert McLendon, a Charter member of James B. Green Lodge No. 735.

The daughters made a generous donation to our building fund. Using their donation, we placed a Memorial Stain Glass Window in the Gable on the front of our building, as an honor to their father.

Brother Green was made a Master Mason in Hiram Lodge No. 40 A.F. & A.M. on December 12, 1901. He was Master of Hiram No. 40 in 1905 and again in 1906. He affiliated with Neuse Lodge No. 97 in 1923. He became Treasurer of that Lodge in 1936 and remained so for 36 years, until death on September 11, 1964.

Neuse Lodge 97 became Millbrook Lodge No. 97 in 1945 and it was once known as Forestville Lodge No. 97. The Jewels of Millbrook still bear the Wake Forest inscriptions.

He received his 50-year Membership Award in 1952 from the Grand Lodge of North Carolina and he was made a "Life Member" of Millbrook Lodge No. 97 in 1953. He received "The Golden Jubilee Award" in 1963. He was a member of the York Rite Masonic Bodies of Raleigh.

His funeral, with full Masonic Honors, was held in the Millbrook United Methodist Church. His body is buried in the Church Cemetery at Millbrook.

The Year of 1965 - The Start of a New Lodge

THE BEGINNING OF JAMES B. GREEN LODGE

We read in the Book of Saint John, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by Him and without Him was not anything made that was made."

It is no secret that all of the Masons who ever lived, first expressed a belief in God before he was ever admitted into a Lodge, and so it is that Masons are a friendly family, an many of us linger to exchange thoughts and ideas, sometime long after the meetings are adjourned.

Such was the case in late Spring 1965, after Worshipful Brother James Starling Johnson Jr. had completed his tenure as Master of Raleigh Lodge 500. He and Brother Stuart Buchanan, together, discussed the possibility of forming a new lodge. It had been about sixty-five years since the last one was instituted as Raleigh 500 in the year 1900. Knowing these Brethren to be young men it was assumed that neither was a Charter Member of Raleigh 500. Their enthusiasm was contagious. Soon Brother Jimmy was at the Grand Lodge Office to relate his idea to Most Worshipful Brother Charles A. Harris, Secretary and Past Grand Master of Masons in North Carolina, Worshipful Brother Pete Dudley, and Worshipful Brother Hiram Casebolt who all were in agreement with the idea.

Communication was made with all the Lodges in the district, all of which were also in agreement. Cards were signed by thirty-seven Brother Masons who were intent on becoming Charter Members of the new lodge, several of whom were of other Grand Jurisdictions. A petition was then filed with the Grand Lodge. On October 11th, 1965 the Grand Lodge under MW Brother Sam Hennis, authorized the Lodge to be operated Under Dispensation (UD) until April 1966 when the Grand Lodge unanimously approved the petition for James B. Green Lodge 735, Ancient Free & Accepted Masons.

The name "James B. Green" was selected to honor Worshipful Brother James B. Green, Past Master of Hiram 40, who during his long and useful life was a devoted member of the craft.

Several offers were made for a meeting place, and on invitation of Millbrook Lodge 97, meetings were held in that Lodge Hall until a hall of our own was completed. A rental fee of fifty cents per member each quarter was paid, and was later increased to seventy-five cents per member per quarter.

It should be noted that while we were in the Millbrook Lodge we were happy to have every courtesy shown us by the Brethren there and we left with regret to be separated from them. Our rent to them was very small, and it should be stated that nothing was paid for rent during the time we were Under Dispensation.

On October 11, 1965, MWBro Sam A. Hennis Jr., Grand Master of Masons in North Carolina, granted a dispensation to thirty-seven Brethren to form James B. Green Lodge UD. At the appointed hour, the Grand Master called the meeting to order and directed the Grand Secretary to read the roll for the meeting, the dispensation, and the names of the Brethren who had been selected to serve as officers of the new Lodge.

With the Brethren seated west of the Altar, MWBro W. Edward Burrier PGM acting as Grand Marshall and assisted by RWBro Robert N. Bass Jr. invested them with the jewels and aprons of their respective offices and conducted them to their stations.

It is required of our Friend and Brother --- JAMES STARLING JOHNSON, JR. --- to take special care that all and every of the said brethren of the said lodge, as well as those hereafter to be admitted into our body by said lodge, be regularly made Masons: and that they do and observe and keep all the Constitution, Regulations, and laws of our Grand Lodge, and that the Ancient Landmarks be strictly attended to; and further, that he do cause to be entered in a book kept for that purpose, an account of the proceedings of said lodge which, when done, is to be transmitted to the Grand Lodge with a list of those initiated, passed, and raised. and otherwise disposed of under his authority.

The Grand Master then opened a Master Masons Lodge with the following officers in their stations and places:

- Sr. Deacon William D. Moon

- J.C. Knowles as Chaplain
- Henry Dempster Jr. as Tyler

The By-Laws, which had been approved by the Grand Lodge, were read and approved by the Lodge.

Those in attendance for the ceremony were presented by MWBro Charles A. Harris PGM & Grand Secretary. These included MWBro Edward Burrier PGM, RWBro Robert N. Bass Jr. JGW, WBro Berl M. Kahn Grand Steward, WBro Fred F. Harding Jr. Grand Tyler, WBro Robert P. Dudley Assistant Grand Secretary, the District Deputy Grand Masters of the 21st, 23rd, 24th, and 31st Districts. The Masters of Lodges 40, 97, 115, 198, 231, 377, 500, 565, 683, and Bro Herbert Ruffin, Past Potentate Sudan Temple

The next night, October 12, 1965, we held our first Stated Communication at the Millbrook Lodge Hall. At this meeting, we elected the following Trustees: Jack Moore, to a 1-year term, Dick Yancey, for 2 years and George L. Stockstill for 3 years. We also received petitions for degrees from George S. Bickel, Richard F. Coley, L. Tommy Lassiter, James W. Speed III, James D. Caprell, Harold L. Jones, Charles L. Martin, and George M. Stockstill. Charles Martin withdrew his petition in November that year.

At the Dec 14 meeting, Bro Fred G. Speidel, Past Commander of Raleigh Commandery No.4, WBro Hiram J. Casebolt PM. Elliot Swindell Jr., and WBro George W. White PM, presented the Lodge a Tyler's sword. This sword was gift of the Raleigh York Rite Bodies and was engraved by Jeffries Jewelers of Raleigh.

We completed that year with a total of 37 members who had affiliated with our new Lodge.

The Year of 1966 - Getting Started

While Under Dispensation we raised seven new brothers to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason, each of whom became Charter Members of James B. Green Lodge.

We had an emergent communication Jan 25 for the purpose of raising the first four: Brothers George Bickel, Richard Coley, James W. Speed III, and George M. Stockstill.

We then had a Valentine Party on Feb 11 at Trinity Methodist Church, all members who had children brought them, and we had loads of fun. We also began to have supper at Griffins about this time.

An Emergent Communication was held on Feb 22, for the purpose of Raising Bros James D. Caprell, Harold L. Jones, and L. Tommy Lassiter. Walter J. "Bud" Dedman was also Raised as a courtesy for Millbrook

97. We had forty-six visitors present at this time together with nineteen of our members. WBro Jack O. Howard presented Tommy Lassiter (His son-in-law) a Masonic Bible, the same being used during the ceremony.

Several of these original seven Brothers are now Past Masters including Harold L. Jones in 1971, George M. Stockstill in 1973, James W. Speed III in 1976, and L. Tommy Lassiter in 1985.

At the March 8 meeting, a motion was passed to set the annual lodge dues at \$11.00, to be paid starting in April 1966.

On April 22, 1966, we had a memorable event. We were consecrated James B. Green Lodge 735 A.F.& A.M. Grand Master Arnold J. Koonce Sr. opened a Master Mason's Lodge in Ample form with the following officers present and assisting: Hiram J. Casebolt DGM, Robert N. Bass Jr. as Sr. Grand Warden, Poosey L. Bryand as Jr. Grand Warden, George F. White as Grand Treasurer, Charles A. Harris Grand Secretary, W. Fred Harding Grand Tyler, W. Gale Parker as Sr. Grand Deacon, Bruce C. Ferrell as Jr. Grand Deacon, Robert P. Dudley and H. Lester Creech as Grand Steward, and Harrison Kaufman as Grand Chaplain. The first elected officers were then installed as regular officers of James B. Green Lodge 735. Numerous distinguished guests were present and spoke briefly. The Grand Master spoke last and "wished the new lodge God speed, and enduring success." That night will be long remembered by all those present.

On June 14, Bro Paul M. Brown became a member by affiliation. Bros Tom Green and Joe Bishop were made Master Masons at an Emergent meeting June 22.

On July 14, we had a busy meeting. WBro Hiram J. Casebolt DDGM made his official visit. Bro Stuart Terry, who had been raised by Hiram 40, passed the proficiency test for the Master Mason's Degree. At that meeting, we raised Vincent J. Iraggi, Lawrence Ray Davis, Wilbur E. House, and Ted Green to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason. There were present: thirty-five visiting Brethren, six from Millbrook 97, eighteen from Hiram 40, four from William G. Hill 218, one from Granville 380, one from Number 271 in Miami, Fl., one each from 210, and 212 and one from Northern 25 in Newark, NJ. Several of our own members were present.

We had our first election of officers as a constituted Lodge on Dec 13, 1966.

On Dec 21, 1966, James E. Armstrong Sr., Robert T. Barham, Ray M. DeBerry of James B. Green plus William J. Price and Cliften W. Stoffregen for Millbrook 97, were made Master Masons.


We ended the year with 56 members in the Lodge. Of the new members, 18 were Raised and 1 was admitted by transfer.

In Ample Form assembled, according to the Old Constitution, regularly and salemnly established under the auspices of Prince Edwin at the City of Hork, in Great Britain, in the year of Masonry 4926,bix:

appoint, authorize, and empower our worthy Brother. James Starling Johnson, Jr. Marion Eugene White to be the Senior to be the Master our worthy Brother Warden, and our worthy Brother. Alexander Holder, Jr. to be the Junior Warden of a lodge of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons, to be by virtue hereof constituted formed, , which lodge shall be distinguished by the name or Millbrook 735 and the said Master and James B. Green Wardens, and their successors in office are hereby respectively, authorized and directed, by and with consent and assistance of the members of the said lodge present upon such occasions, to elect install the officers of the said lodge as vacancies happen in manner and form as is, or may be, prescribed by the Constitution and laws of this Grand Lodge. And further, the said lodge is hereby invested with full power and authority to assemble upon proper and lawful occasions to make Masons, and to admit members, as also to do and perform all and every such acts and things appertaining to the Craft, as have been and ought to be done for the honor and advantage thereof, conforming in all their proceedings to the Constitution and laws of this Grand Lodge; otherwise this warrant and the power's thereby granted are to cease and to be of no further Given under our hands and the seal of our Grand Lodge at the City of Raleigh, North Carolina, in the United States

Master M. Eugene White, SW Alex Holder Jr., JW William D. Moon, Treasurer William C. Beamon, Secretary James S. Johnson Jr. PM. The Master appointed the following officers: SD Paul Etheridge Jr., JD Herbert W. Wheless, George A. Yancey and Jack D. Moore as Stewards, Chaplain J.C. Knowles, and George L. Stockstill as Tyler.

On March 23, Bertram Pollett from our lodge and Roger A. Watkins from Millbrook 97 were raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason, again we had thirty visitors. Bro Billy Ray became a member by affiliation on May 9. Daniel Lee Ellis, Robert D. Hewett, Aaron H. Hocutt, and Bill D. Mizelle became Master Masons by the same ancient route on June 7. We went to Millbrook Baptist Church for St. John's Day June 26 with Bro J.C. Knowles bringing the message. We elected Maurice Lipscomb to membership by affiliation on Sep 12, 1967. Bro Lorenzo Dallas Spruill was raised Oct 5, 1967.

Election of Officers was held, for the year 1968, at the meeting on Dec 12.

We ended the year with 70 members. There were 15 new members, 7 of whom were Raised and 8 were admitted by transfer. We had 1 member to Demit.

The Year of 1968

Master Alex Holder Jr., SW Paul Etheridge Jr., JW Bud Wheless, Treasurer W. Charles Beamon, Secretary James S. Johnson Jr. PM. L.D. Lloyd was elected trustee, his term to expire in 1970. The Master appointed the following: SD Jack D. Moore, JD James C. Abrams, Stewards Harold Jones and Larry Davis, Chaplain J.C. Knowles, and Tyler George L. Stockstill.

At the first meeting on Jan 9, it was decided to start eating at a local restaurant before the Stated Meetings. The time for supper was set at 6:30. It was also decided to start publishing a Lodge newsletter, thus was started the tradition of the James B. Green Trestle Board. Each Master has had that responsibility since.

Bro George L. Stockstill was made a "Life Member" on February 13, 1968. He became the first member to receive this honor. He said it was the highest honor he could receive because it is given by those who know and respect him

Bro Rex A. Girton was raised by Millbrook 97 as a courtesy to us on March 1, 1968.

The Lodge Building Committee was very active during this time, trying to locate property on which to build. Numerous BBQ suppers were held as fund raising events. On one such occasion, 1295 plates were sold for the good cause of a Lodge building.

Bros Nathan V. Whittington and John D. Butler were raised on May 28 that same year.

On Sep 10, another new lodge was on the way as we granted approval for J.J. Crowder to be formed.

At the June, meeting it was announced that WBro Alex Holder had accepted employment in Tennessee. Bro Paul Etheridge Jr. served as the acting Master and did so for the rest of the meetings that year.

The first of our members to be called by the Supreme Architect was our beloved Bro Joe Bishop. His Masonic Funeral was held at Oakwood Cemetery October 9, 1968, with Bro Harry Holland acting as Master. Bro Joe was elected to receive the Degrees Dec 14, 1965 and was Raised on June 2, 1966. He was with us for such a short while, but he endeared himself to us by his friendly manner and kindly spirit.

We went to church at Trinity Methodist Dec 15, 1968 for our Christmas service. Bro George L. Stockstill brought us an excellent message.

MWBro Robert N. Bass Jr. Grand Master was the installing officer for the 1969 officers. WBro Gage Smith was the installing Marshall, WBro Otto Neustadt Chaplain, and Fred G. Speidel Secretary

The Lodge membership now totaled 76. That year 6 new members were Raised and 2 were admitted for membership. We lost 1 brother to Demit. We had our first Brother taken from us by death that year.

The Year of 1969

Master Paul Etheridge Jr., SW Hebert W. Wheless, JW Jack D. Moore, Treasurer W. Charles Beamon, Secretary James S. Johnson Jr. PM. The Master appointed Harold Jones SD, Don Etheridge JD, George M. Stockstill and Claiborn Burnette as Stewards, George L. Stockstill as Chaplain and Bobby Senter as Tyler. George L. Stockstill was elected Trustee until 1971.

We had a Valentine Party on Feb 14 at the Millbrook Lodge. It was a very cold night (10 degrees), but everyone came and we had a good time. The children had games upstairs and the adults were entertained downstairs. Each family brought refreshments. We had a great time and lots of fun for all the family members.

Bro Marvin Guess Jr. and Carley H. Smith became Master Masons on Feb 25, 1969.

A major highlight was the meeting of May 13. It was a stated meeting and one long to be remembered by many. That night Bro Frank Maddery of "Old 97" Millbrook was recognized as DDGM of the 25th District and he introduced all the Past Masters present: G.W. White, P.A. Scott, and R.N. Bass Jr., all from 97. Also present were Dee O. Linberry PM of 218, and R.G. Smith DDGL. Robert N. Bass Jr. PGM escorted MWBro William A. Hooks Grand Master of Masons in North Carolina to the East, where Grand Honors were received.

That evening Bro Banks Holt was received into membership by affiliation. Bro Tom Green conducted Bro Ray Catlette before the Altar, where the Worshipful Master presented him his 25-year service award. The secretary conducted Bro George L. Stockstill to the Altar for prayer after which he was conducted to the East. He stood to the left of the Grand Master who was then presiding and presented him his 50-year service award and pin. Bro George M. Stockstill pinned the emblem on the lapel of his father's coat and reminded him that he would not have the pleasure of doing the same for him.

Recollecting of the 50 years past, Bro George L. Stockstill said he did not become a Mason out of curiosity, but that the earliest remembrance he had of his father was that he was a dedicated Master Mason. In those days, the Brethren rode on horseback to the meetings all of which were held on Saturday night. Often

three or four would stop at our house for the night and I would awake to hear them reciting the catechism, which then had no meaning to me. It should be mentioned here too that in those days everything that was learned about Masonry was by word of mouth.

The last act before closing the lodge was a beautiful prayer by the Illustrious Bro Harrison Kaufman, longtime friend of George L. Stockstill. Bro Kaufman was loved and honored by all who had the privilege to know him.

During the term of WBro Paul Etheridge Jr., the Chaplain was requested to read from the Holy Bible, which proved to be well received by many of the Brethren. It is a requirement of Masonry that the Holy Bible is always open on the Altar during the communications of the Lodge. How many of you have ever heard it read for enlightenment?

An Emergent Communication on Feb 22, 1969 was called for the purpose of raising Bros Archie C. Capps, Lonnie M. Dean, and James Jefferson Stephens as a courtesy for Millbrook 97. Ceburn Harris Mangum for William G. Hill 218 and Edgar Donald Farmer for James B. Green 735 were raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason.

Another new lodge was in the making, on June 10, 1969, when we were asked permission to form Vandora Lodge UD, Garner, NC, and we were happy to comply.

Saints John's Day was celebrated on June 25, 1969 with a service at Trinity Methodist Church.

WBro R. Gage Smith PM was made an Honorary Member of our Lodge on Aug 12, 1969. On Oct 11, Bro John F. Hutchins was elected to membership by affiliation.

An Emergent Communication was called for Lodge members only on Nov 28. The meeting was called by the Master to vote on the following items: buying a building on Glenwood Avenue, buying a lot with two houses already on the lot located in the North Hills area, or proceeding to buy an unimproved lot for the building of a Lodge Hall. All of these items failed to pass the vote. There was also discussion of the possibilities of moving our meeting place to the Old Grand Lodge Hall in downtown Raleigh. After this meeting, every member began an earnest search for a lot on which to build a Temple.

Officers for the year 1970 were elected at a stated meeting on Dec 11, 1969. Worshipful Bro Charles A. Harris PGM and Grand Secretary was the installing officer that year. All our installations have been formal and open to the families and friends of members. The meetings were usually followed by refreshments.

The Membership had grown to total 84. We Raised 4 new Brothers and admitted 5 for membership. We had to exclude 1 Brother for nonpayment of dues.

The Year of 1970 - Time to Build a Temple

Master Jack D. Moore, SW Harold L. Jones, JW Donald M. Etheridge, Treasurer W.C. Beamon, Secretary WBro James S. Johnson Jr. PM. The Master appointed the following officers: SD James C. Abrams, JD George M. Stockstill, Rex A. Girton and Stuart Terry were appointed as Stewards, Edwin H. Poole as Chaplain, and John W. Beal as Tyler.

At the Jan 13, 1970 meeting, Rex Girton presented the Lodge a beautiful set of working tools, which he had skillfully carved. Bro Harold Jones presented the Lodge with a new Masonic Bible. The Bible currently being used in the Lodge had been presented by WBro James S. Johnson Jr. PM, our first Master. It is to be preserved in the archives of the Lodge. Bro George I. Stockstill wished himself and John Butler a happy birthday. We were about to get us "a good ten cent cook", for on this night we initiated Robert D. Truelove along with Ray B. Champion, James F. Hutchins as EA.



We were all getting near to the day when we would have our own Temple and Bro L.D. Lloyd, a trustee, informed the Lodge that we might purchase some property on Jeffreys School Road (later the name was changed to Lynn Road). The Trustees were authorized to determine the zoning of the property and obtain an option not to exceed \$6,000. We had some disappointment because of a previously zoning ruling. This time we were successful. This was Feb 10 and we were on our way to our new home on Lynn Road, but it was not paved with gold.

We were right back to the Lodge the next night Feb 11, in an Emergent meeting for the purpose of raising Bros Alex Mackintosh, Charles C. Youell III, and Bobby W. Hicks. At the March 18 meeting, we raised Bros Robert D. Truelove, Rayford B. Champion, James A. Hutchins, James M. Stell, and Johnny G. Williams.

Bros Norman O. Dickens and Frank Inman became members by affiliation on April 14. At this meeting, a Building Committee was appointed. Bro George L. Stockstill was chairman, along with Rex Girton, George M. Stockstill, John Hutchins, and Forest Pearce.

Worshipful Brother Hiram J. Casebolt PM of Raleigh 500 was made an honorary member of our Lodge on May 12. At that time, he presented Bro Elliot I. Peterson his 50 Year Service Award and Pin as courtesy for Trinity Lodge located in Clinton, Massachusetts. At the same time a 25 Year Service Award was presented to Bro Ervin Poole.

Some happy observations of this new Lodge by an older Brother and Master Mason, who for more than fifty years never held an elected office in the line, is the fact that nearly all the Brethren have passed the proficiency examination for the 3rd degree and could in fact preside in any station for an degree on short notice and can coach candidates in all degrees.

On June 3, 1970, we raised Bros Wiley B. Jackson, Tommy Jeffreys, and Bobby C. Watson. All of the presiding officers had been raised in this Lodge, except James C. Abrams who presided in the West. George M. Stockstill was in the East, and James Speed III in the South. Rex Girton SD, Laverne Lewis JD, Robert Truelove and James Hutchins were Stewards. James S. Johnson Jr. PM was the Secretary.

Bros Wesley Chatham and Arnold Kropp were elected to membership by affiliation on July 14, 1970. On this date, the Trustees were given approval to secure a loan of fifteen- thousand dollars from Raleigh Savings & Loan Association for the construction of the Lodge Hall on Lynn Road. Bro Frank Maddery DDGM paid his official visit to our Lodge on Sep 12.

An Emergent Communication was held Sep 2 for the purpose of conducting a Masonic Funeral for Bro Paul Moore Brown, Uncle of Bro James S. Johnson Jr. The funeral was held at the Seaboard North Carolina Cemetery with Bro Harry Holland assisting in the service.

The Lodge received dispensation from the Grand Lodge dated Aug 24, 1970, to construct a Lodge Hall in accordance with the plans submitted. This dispensation is on permanent file with the minutes of this Lodge, and "The People had a mind to build."



Bro Harold Thatcher became a member by affiliation Oct 13, 1970. Bro Heber C. Eason was received as a member by affiliation Dec 8 and we elected officers for the year 1971.

We ended the year with 103 members. We had Raised 12 and admitted 9 new members. We had 2 members to pass away that year.

The Year of 1971 - Moving to a New Home

Master Harold L. Jones, SW Donald M. Etheridge, JW George M. Stockstill, Teas. W. Charles Beamon, Secretary James S. Johnson Jr. PM. The Master appointed the following officers: SD Rex A. Girton, JD John F. Hutchins, James W. Speed III and Claiborn W. Burnette as Stewards, James A. Hutchins as Chaplain, and Norman O. Dickens as Tyler.

On January 12, 1971, the Lodge approved a motion to meet twice monthly.

On Feb 12, the Grand Lodge granted the request for the Lodge to hold the first meeting in the newly completed Temple on Feb 23. 1971. WBro Harold Jones requested WBro Jack D. Moore PM, to occupy the East and open the Lodge for the first time in the new Temple. WBro Jack was Master during the construction of the building. When we worked many nights and all Saturdays, he was seldom absent. At the end of the meeting, WBro Harold Jones requested Bro George L. Stockstill to occupy the East and to close the Lodge for our first meeting in this new Temple.

Just for the record, it should be stated that, the building we are so proud to be in was constructed by the Members of "James B. Green Lodge" in the year WBro Jack D. Moore was Master of the Lodge. Every nail that was driven in the building (except for the shingles) was put there by some member of the Lodge at that time. There was never any discontent or grumbling by anyone and it "did not rain in the daytime" during the actual building of the Temple. The furniture of the Lodge was made by the Brethren: A Labor Of Love and Devotion. "TO GOD BE THE GLORY, GREAT THINGS HE HATH DONE." I (George L. Stockstill) offer thanks to God for having a part in it.

We were back again Feb 25, for an Emergent Communication the purpose of which was to Raise the first Brethren in the new Temple. The Brethren were Raymond A. Boseman and William D. Shamblin. We had seven visiting Brethren that night: from Granville Lodge 380, WBro Pete Dudley PM, assistant to the Grand Sec, and Bro Charles Poole from Garner Lodge 701.

Bro Eugene R. Ray became a member by affiliation on April 13. On April 27, William A. Bethune, Ernest O. Lassiter, and Ellis M. Meekins were made Master Masons. Bro Bethune was a courtesy for Radiance Lodge #132 but he would affiliate with us later in the year. The Raleigh Rainbow girls came out on May 12 to do their beautiful and impressive degree work.

On June 8, the Worshipful Master appointed Bros Don Etheridge, George L. Stockstill, and Jack D. Moore as a committee to plan for the dedication of the Temple. On June 20, we went to Hill Crest Baptist Church for St. John the Baptist's birthday celebration. Bro Preston Smith was elected to membership by affiliation on July 13.

On August 10, Bro Fred G. Speidel lectured on our Patron Saints: St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist, which proved to be interesting as well as enlightening. We were pleased to learn of Bro Don Etheridge Jr. being elected State Master Counselor of North Carolina DeMolay.

George L. Stockstill reported a visit that he and several Brethren made to Granville Lodge way up the other side of the Harrigans. (Ed. Note: For the uninformed,' this is an area in Northern Wake County above Hwy 98, toward Creedmoor on Hwy 50, that was renowned for the illegal production of Moonshine Whiskey and various other commodities) They made Brother Jimmy an honorary member of their Lodge. They asked George to speak and Harold told them they would be sorry. They did not say later if they were. The building and the furnishings were quaint but honorable, and the building was guarded by several wasps. It was most enjoyable. I think WBro Jimmy sort of revived them. He did a pretty good job of promoting Masonic relations. It was because of him that this history was written. I am not sure that anyone other than he would have ever thought of forming James B. Green Lodge. Credit also is due to Jimmy from J.J. Crowder Lodge and Vandora Lodge. Masonry was a "way of life" with Bro Jimmy.

Bros C. Roger Morgan and W. A. Bethune became members by affiliation on Sep 14. Three Brethren were raised Sep 28. They were Arthur R. Brink Jr., Paul L. Bumgarner, and John T. Gattis.

On Saturday Oct 9, 1971, the Grand Lodge of North Carolina held an Emergent Communication in the James B. Green Lodge Temple, for the purpose of a conducting a Ceremony of Dedication. Most Worshipful Bro William W. Mimms PM Joppa Lodge #530 was Grand Master, RWBro James A. Hutchins as Deputy Grand Master, RWBro Don M. Etheridge as Sr. Grand Warden, RWBro George McLean Stockstill as Jr. Grand Warden, RW William C. Beamon as Grand Treasurer, RWBro Lonnie D. Lloyd as Sr. Grand Secretary, WBro James W. Speed III as Sr. Grand Deacon, and WBro John F. Hutchins as Jr. Grand Deacon (the above Brethren all from J.B. Green 735). WBro Hiram J. Casebolt PM (500) as Grand Marshall, WBro Claiborn Burnette and WBro F. Inman as Grand Stewards (735), WBro Norman O. Dickens (735) as Grand Tyler, WBro Jack D. Moore PM (735) as Grand Chaplain. Other Grand Officers and Past Grand Masters present included: MW Jimmy W. Brewer PGM and Grand Treasurer (708), MW C.A. Harris PGM and Grand Secretary (113), WBro S.F. Noble PM and Sr. Grand Deacon, WBro H.J. Casebolt PM and Jr. Grand Deacon (500), WBro J.E. Watson PM and Grand Steward (691), WBro R.P. Dudley PM and Assistant to the Grand Secretary (202), and WBro R.G. Smith PM and DDGM (218). The Grand Master dispensed with labor and several guests who were not Master Masons were admitted for the Ceremony. The Ceremony of Dedication was then conducted with the usual Masonic custom.

WBro Harold Jones, Master of James B. Green Lodge 735, was the Master of Ceremonies. Bro Rex A. Girton SD of 735, was the Principal Architect, WBro Alex Holder PM of 735, was the Bearer of the Constitution, and WBro Paul Etheridge Jr. PM of 735 was the Bearer of the Three Great lights.

The special guests included Mrs. Sarah Green McLendon and Miss Margret Green of Raleigh. They were the daughters of the late James B. Green in whose honor the Lodge was named. The husband of Sarah, Bro Richard McLendon a charter member, was also present. Sarah and Bro Richard live in Winston Salem, North Carolina. Bro Richard is not privileged to be present often. Mrs. C. Roger Morgan was organist for the occasion. There were 38 of our members present, 12 visiting Brethren, and 12 Grand Officers.

On Nov 23, 1971, Bros Francis P. Buchanan, and Jerry Lee Nalls were Raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason. The first officers elected in the New Temple were elected on Dec 14, 1971 for the upcoming year of 1972.

We ended the year with a total membership of 121. We had Raised 13 new members and admitted 7 for membership. We excluded 2 members for nonpayment of dues.

Master Don M. Etheridge, SW George M. Stockstill, JW Rex A. Girton, Treasurer W. Charles Beamon, Secretary W. Preston Smith. The Master appointed the following officers to serve with him: SD James F. Hutchins, JD James Speed III, Stewards were Claiborn W. Burnette and Norman O. Dickens. Chaplain was James A. Hutchins. Tyler was Stuart Terry.

Bro Milton Cohen was elected to membership by affiliation on Jan 25, 1972. WBro Hiram Casebolt PM lectured on the duties and responsibilities of the Lodge officers.

Bro Charles H. Watkins came to us by affiliation on Feb 18. WBro R. Gage Smith, DDGM of the 25th, district paid his official visit to discuss the orphanage situation, laws, and offences. The Worshipful Master announced that we would hold our first Family Night on Feb 25.

On Apr 25, Bros Eugene Boney, Rockey A. Hester III, John W. Hudson, Bruce E. Marshburn, and Charles C. Pearce were Raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason. We were late getting home.

The boys who cut the grass wanted a riding lawn mower. A good buy for \$150.00 was approved at the May 9 meeting.

Bro Charles A. Harris Grand Secretary paid us a friendly visit and introduced his, guest, WBro Ben Akin, first Master of Butner Lodge 697. Bro Charles has always been a good friend of James B. Green Lodge.

On April 13, 1972, Bro Eugene R. Ray was admitted to membership by affiliation. We raised the following Brethren to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason: Felix Pool, Charles J. Griffin, James W. Baldwin, and Robert L. Oakley

Bro Herbert N. Robertson became a member by affiliation on June 13, 1972.

During the meeting on July 11, WBro James S. Johnson Jr. PM presented the Grand Master's Award for 1971 to WBro Harold Jones PM. WBro Jones accepted the Award on behalf of all the Brethren of the Lodge.

Bro Jack L. Walters became a member by affiliation on Aug 8. Bro Rex Girton announced the forming of a \$5.00 Club to help defray the expenses of the Lodge.

We were saddened by the death of our friend Mr. H.O. Jordan who perished when his home burned. His wife, young son age five, lovely daughter age thirteen and mother-in-law also perished. Mr. Jordan was a good friend of several members of our Lodge. He poured and finished the concrete for in our lower floor without charge. Several of our members attended the funeral services.

The uniformed Degree Team from Hiram Lodge 40, Raleigh, was with us on June 27, for the purpose of conferring the 3rd degree on the following Brethren: Charles B. Dent, Dennis P. Hughes, and Johnny Martin. WBro Charles Separk PM in the East, WBro John White PM in the West, Bro T. M. Teester in the South, and Bro Howard Perry was JD. The first section had Rex Girton in the East, George Stockstill in the West, Charles Pearce in the South and Jim Speed SD, Bill Hudson JD, Norman Dickens and Frank Inman as Stewards.

Bros Edwin N. Kerns, Harvey G. Jackson, and Bobby Ray Johnson became Master Masons on Aug 1972. On Sep 26, Bro Lloyd M. Hunter became a member by affiliation.

Annual dues for membership were raised to \$40.00 on Nov 14, 1972, to become effective at the start of 1973.

Bros James F. Edgerton and Edward J. Master Jr. were made Master Masons on Nov 21, 1972.

On Dec 12, we elected officers for 1973. They were duly installed at an Emergent Communication on Dec 20, 1972 by WBro Paul Etheridge Jr. PM installing officer, WBro C.B. McLean PM Millbrook 97, installing Marshall, George L. Stockstill, installing Chaplain, WBro James S. Johnson Jr. PM. Secretary. WBro James S. Johnson Jr. presented Past Masters Certificates to WBros Paul Etheridge Jr., Harold Jones, and Don M. Etheridge, all Past Masters of James B. Green Lodge.

The Charter of the Lodge was presented to the Worshipful Master by WBro Don M. Etheridge PM. The Past Masters Jewel and Apron were presented to WBro Don M. Etheridge by his brother WBro Paul Etheridge Jr. PM.

WBro George S. Stockstill was presented an engraved Gavel as a token of love from his father and his daughters, Elizabeth, and Barbara Ellen. Bro Preston S. Smith was our outgoing, efficient Secretary, who like President Calvin Cool edge did not "Choose to Run" for another term.

Our membership had grown to 137 Brothers. That year we Raised 13 Brothers and admitted 7. We had to exclude 3 Brothers for nonpayment of dues and 1 Brother Demitted.

The Year of 1973

Master George M. Stockstill, SW Rex A. Girton, JW John F. Hutchins, Secretary C. Roger Morgan, and Treasurer W. Charlie Beamon. The Master appointed: SD James W. Speed III, JD Claiborn Burnette, Norman Dickens and Stuart Terry as Stewards, and Frank Inman as the Tyler

Bro Wes Chatham presented an article on Masonry, the subject being "Are we using our working tools," by WBro F. Walter Muller PM.

On Feb 27, 1973, we raised Bros George S. Goodwin, Arthur M. Matthews, Curtis Presley, and Donald R. Price to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason. Donald M. Etheridge Jr. made application for the degree on March 13, 1973 and signed his petition on his 21st. birthday. He was the first applicant of this Lodge to do so. Terry R. Young also made application on this date. Bro James Hutchins gave a most informative program on the Masonic Relationship to the Holy Bible.

We made Master Masons of Bros William C. Tulloss and Charles E. Bailey on March 27, 1973. WBro Harold Jones PM and our golf team had earned a trophy at a tournament. We do not think they were playing Jack Nicholas or others of that caliber.

The son of our immediate Past Master Don M. Etheridge Sr., Don M. Etheridge Jr. became a Master Mason June 26, along with Bros Robert W. Green, John W. Williams, and Robert Young.

We hope we will have other father & son Master Masons. We now have two, Bros George M. Stockstill PM and his father George L. Stockstill, who claims to be past everything, but NOT a Past Master. It is always a pleasure to see a father Raise his son to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason.

On Sep 25, we were visited by WBro Otto Neustadt, who gave a most interesting lecture on "Masonic Courtesy." We were always happy to have WBro R. Gage Smith DDGM come to visit us. We formally received him as DDGM of the 25th Masonic District, at which time he presented WBro Norman C. Miller as DEC and Bro Rex Girton as DDGL.

Bro Robert L. Puckett and Bro Robert K. Hartley were received into membership by affiliation on Oct 9, 1973. WBro Paul Etheridge Jr. PM presented Bro Charles H. Watkins his 25 Year Service Award. Bro Otis V. Jones of William G. Hill 218 showed slides and spoke to us about the doings of the Grand Lodge of England. He has a large collection of Lodge Souvenirs in his home, which he invited our members to view.

The Grand Lodge of North Carolina requested that we present Bro Edward D. Jeffries his 50 Year Service Emblem for the Grand Lodge of Virginia. The Presentation was made by Bro George L. Stockstill. Bro Jefferies is a member of Pleasant Lodge #63 in Roanoke, Virginia.

Election for Officers for 1974 was held on Dec 11, 1973. The Lodge was closed by George L. Stockstill, father of the Worshipful Master, this being the last act of WBro George M Stockstill as Master of the Lodge.

The last stated meeting was held Christmas night by the newly elected Master, WBro Rex Girton. On that Christmas night, the following Brethren were present: Rex Girton Master, Charles C. Pearce acting as SW, James W. Speed III JW, Roger Morgan as Secretary, George L. Stockstill as Chaplain, Claiborn Burnette SD, Norman O. Dickens JD, Stuart Terry and Don Etheridge Jr. acting as Stewards, and Bro Robert Truelove acting as Tyler. There were others including WBro Don M. Etheridge Sr. PM.

The Lodge membership had decreased to 135. We had Raised 10 new Brothers and admitted 1 for membership. We had 10 Brothers to Demit and we had to exclude 3 Brothers for nonpayment of dues.

The Year of 1974

Master Rex A. Girton, SW John F. Hutchins, JW James W. Speed III, Treasurer W. Charlie Beamon, and Secretary C. Roger Morgan. The Master appointed: George L. Stockstill as Chaplain, SD Claiborn W. Burnette, JD Charles Pearce, Stuart Terry and J. William Hudson as Stewards, and William C. Tulloss as Tyler

Bros Alan L. Novak and Bro Robert L. Puckett became Master Masons Jan 29, 1974. Bibles were presented to the Brethren by WBro Laverne Lewis. Feb 12, Bro Walter C. Gibson Jr. was elected to membership by affiliation.

We Raised the following Brethren to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on April 23, 1974: William F. Baker and Paul T. Parker. The same was done for Bros Donald R. Howard and J. Earl Koobs on June 4. On June 25, Bros Johnson L. Clement Jr. and Donald R. Rees were Raised to the Degree of Master Masons.

Bro John P. Hollis was elected to membership by affiliation on Aug 13, 1974.

Bro Joe Partin presented the Lodge with a beautiful picture of the aircraft carrier Enterprise, which was built by the Newport Virginia shipyard, from which Bro Joe has recently retired. Raleigh is his new home.

On Sep 24, the following Brethren became Master Masons: Jackson H. Craig, David A. Jensen Jr., John E. King, and Asa M. Manning. Again, we had a long, long night.

Bro J. Harold Myatt Jr. was duly elected a member by affiliation on Nov 12, 1974.

We again elected officers for another year on Dec 10, 1974.

This year the total membership increased to 141 members. We Raised 12 new Brothers and admitted 4 for affiliation. We had to exclude 8 Brothers for nonpayment of dues and had 2 Brothers to Demit.

The Year of 1975

Master John F. Hutchins, SW James W. Speed, III, JW Claiborn W. Burnette, Treasurer W. Charles Beamon, Secretary C. Roger Morgan. George L. Stockstill was elected trustee, his term to expire in 1977. The Master appointed the following Brethren to, serve with him: SD Stuart Terry, JD J. William Hudson, James A. Hutchins and Harvey G. Jackson as Stewards, Tyler William C. Tulloss, Assistant Secretary was WBro Don M. Etheridge Sr. PM and George L. Stockstill as Chaplain.

At our first meeting in January 1975, the Brethren had a moment of Silent Prayer in memory of Bro Jackson L. Craig who passed away Jan 5, 1975. Bro Craig was raised Sep 24, 1974. He had passed his proficiency test on the 3rd Degree Nov 26, 1974. We shall always honor his memory here. A Masonic funeral service was held by Eureka Lodge 317, Elizabeth City, as a courtesy for James B. Green.

An Emergent Communication was held on Jan 21 at which time Bro Charles L. Williams and Bro Frankie E. Seamster became Master Masons. WBro Laverne Lewis PM presented each with a copy of the Holy Bible. Bro Herman B. Riggle of Middleton Lodge 34 was presented his 50 year Service Award by WBro Harold L. Jones PM, at the request of the Grand Lodge of West Virginia.

Bros Bruce F. Campbell, John W. Ginger, Bluford R. Glidewell II, James R. Haven, and Gene E. Lloyd all traveled the same ancient route in becoming Master Masons on the night of March 25, 1975.

WBro Paul Etheridge Jr. PM presented a taped address by the Masonic Service Association on introducing new Masons to Mystic Ties on April 8.

On May 27, we raised Bros John H. Walker and Thomas H. Willis to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason. Bro Charlie Graham, a charter member of our Lodge, affiliated with Southern Pines Lodge 484.

On June 2, 1975, J.J. Crowder Lodge 743 was granted permission to use our Lodge Hall for practice sessions upon the approval of the Worshipful Master. Bro Wes Chatham talked about work in the Fellow Craft Degree in the New York Grand Lodge.

We received Bro Sam B. Walker as a member by affiliation on Aug 11.

On Aug 26, we passed a resolution to allow the Order of the Eastern Star to use our Temple as a meeting place for a newly formed chapter of the Eastern Star UD. A committee was appointed by the Worshipful Master to draft the agreement and procedures for the use of the Temple. George L. Stockstill was Chairman of the committee with Claiborn Burnette and Roger Morgan as members.

WBro Norman C. Miller DDGM, WBro Rex Girton DDGL and Bro Otis Jones DEC were received with appropriate honors on Sep 9. WBro Rex A. Girton was presented the Grand Masters Award for 1974. 
The open Installation of officers was conducted on Dec 18. The last Stated Communication for the year was held on Christmas evening by the newly installed officers.

PURRINGTON, JR., Trustees, of Wake County, North Carolina, parties of the second part, sometimes hereinafter called the "Trustees," and the RALEIGH SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of North Carolina, having its principal office in Raleigh, Wake County, North Carolina, party of the third part, sometimes hereinafter called the "Association"; WITNESSETH:

Whereas, the parties of the first part are justly indebted to the Association for money borrowed in the principal sum of Twenty-one Thousand and No/100-----

The WM personally visited Mona Warren, at Oxford Orphanage by our sponsorship. We donated funds for her to purchase some new clothes and personal items. Several members of the Lodge and their wives took Mona to Crabtree on a shopping expedition. She was very grateful to the Lodge for our gifts and concern.

We cooked for close to 200 children that day. That amounts to over 400 hamburgers and 200 hot dogs, all prepared, and served in about 45 minutes. The children really enjoyed the food, some of them several times thru the line. The new cooker really paid off. The cupcakes were a great success. We also visited Mona Warren that day. She had a chance to meet many of the Lodge members and their families.

At the meeting on May 28, it was reported that the WBro James S. Johnson Jr. PM had surgery and was still hospitalized, but was doing better. Several Brothers donated blood to replace that amount required during WBro Jimmy's operation. The WM had been on a mission to get a new sink for the Lodge. Letterman as Stewards, WBro Paul Etheridge Jr. as Chaplain, and Thomas J. Hess as the Tyler.

The year started with a great Valentine's Banquet. Bro Robert D. Truelove cooked and excellent meal that was enjoyed by all. Bro J.C. Knowles gave a very informative talk on Love and its several applications in our lives.

WBro Jack L. Walters DDGL and WBro J. William Hudson DDGM both of the 25th MD made their formal visits to the Lodge in March. WBro Bill Hudson had served as the DDGM for the last 3 years; as such, he will have earned the title of Past DDGM.

Peters as Stewards, Bro Donald W. Moore II as Chaplain, and Gene A. Smith as the Tyler.

January 22nd the Lodge agreed to undertake an interior renovation of the Lodge Room along with several other improvement projects. We were still using the original carpet and it was much worn from years of service. WBro Jack Walters arranged for the installation of a new refrigerator in the kitchen.

February 7th we conducted funeral honors for our Bro Rayford B. Champion. Thanks to WBro Don Bennett for his assistance in conducting the service.

At the February 12th meeting, Bro James Iraggi announced that Bro Tommy Gattis (a member of the NC National Guard) was being mobilized back to Active Duty for 12 months.

The Lodge approved the money to purchase the new carpet at a price of \$4,500 for 310 square yards. It was reported that Bro Bill Tulloss was back in the hospital.





During our Stated on September 23rd, the Master announced that our 50th anniversary T-Shirts should arrive in about a week. Lapel Pins and Commemorative coins have already been ordered.

WBro Jimmy Lassiter is scheduled for a hip surgery. Sue Walters had to have surgery on her shoulder. WBro Hudson is back home and recovering. WBro James Hutchins and his brother WBro John Hutchins are both very sick at this time.

At the meeting on December 9th, the Secretary read the final reports for our Fall Fundraiser. We distributed \$801 to each of our 3 charities for a total of \$2403.

We completed the year with a total membership of 120 Brothers. We had Raised 3 new Brothers and had 1 to Affiliate. We Excluded 4 Brothers for non-payment of dues.
